There had been mosquito outburst at the Muhimbili National Hospital and the surrounding areas of Upanga, Mchikichini and Jangwani (Mwananchi, August 2, 2010). The problem at hand is that mosquito breeding has increased as a result of poor environmental management, public health, urbanization, uncontrolled human activities, and inadequate environmental health education in the area. The underlying argument is that the root cause for malaria problem is not addressed eventually the mosquitoes increase in the Msimbazi valley are defeating the national anti-malaria control initiatives.
